□ MEL Membership Renewal: The Fund is scheduled to renew their MEL membership effective 7/1/16. Enclosed on Page 14 is Resolution 16-13 renewing the Fund's membership in the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2019.

#### □ Motion to Approve Membership in the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund

■ MEL Crime Policy Endorsements – The MEL Coverage Committee worked with the Technical Writer to develop two enhancing endorsements to the JIF Crime Policy. One is extending coverage for Social Engineering exposure and the other as an exception to the Failure to Obtain Insurance exclusion as respects to on line vendor exposure. On Page 16 is a memorandum from the MEL Underwriting Manager.

The Endorsements appear on **Pages 17-19**, if the Fund Commissioners agree with these endorsements, a motion would be in order to accept.

# □ Motion to Accept the Policy Endorsements approved by the MEL Coverage Committee

□ Police Accreditation – As previously discussed, the Fund's Coverage Committee made the recommendation that any member that seeks Police Accreditation be awarded a one time grant of 25% of the cost associated with the program after the member achieves Accreditation. On Page 20 is Resolution 16-19 that establishes the Program.

#### □ Motion to Approve Resolution 16-19 Establishing a Grant Program for Police Accreditation

□ **Property Appraisals Update** – Asset Works has begun field work in several municipalities in the Camden JIF. Work should be complete by mid June. Draft reports will be received by Perma and distributed to RMC's and members for review.

Employment Practices Program: As a reminder, changes to the 2017 POL/EPL Program are posted on the MEL's webpage - www.njmel.org - which details changes to the MEL's Model Personnel Manual and information on training program requirements.

Members have until October 1st to submit the checklist to qualify and/or maintain deductible and co-pay incentives. Compliance includes updating Personnel Manuals, Training Managers & Supervisors, Police Command Staff and offering training to non-supervisory personnel.

<u>Police Command Training</u> – Sessions have been conducted in Collingswood, Voorhees and Winslow. The PMM JIF has one scheduled on May 25<sup>th</sup> at the Marlton Fire Station. Several more sessions will be announced.

<u>Managers & Supervisors Training</u> - Employment Practices Risk Management Program also includes mandatory training of management. Mr. Nardi's has conducted a session in Winslow. Sessions are scheduled in Collingswood on May 24<sup>th</sup>, Cherry Hill on May 25<sup>th</sup> and in Voorhees on June 6<sup>th</sup>. Registration information is on **page 22**.

<u>Elected Officials Training Seminars</u> – Every year, the MEL holds training seminars for elected officials and reduces a member's assessment by \$250 for each municipal elected officials and Administrator completing the course by June 1st. Please visit the MEL webpage for other scheduled classes – njmel.org.

This course is also available on line; directions are on Page 24.

- 2016 Financial Disclosure Forms As previously reported, the fund office has provided all Fund Commissioners and Professionals with the login information they need to complete their Financial Disclosure filing for the Camden JIF. The email included links to the instructions and the DLGS webpage to file your disclosure; filing deadline was April 30<sup>th</sup>.
- □ 2017 Renewal Online Underwriting Database: Members and risk managers will receive an email when the database is set up to begin the 2017 underwriting renewal which is expected to begin on or near June 1, 2016.
- □ 2016 2<sup>nd</sup> Assessment Bills Statement of Accounts were sent out to members with a due date of June 15<sup>th</sup>. A reminder that a new lock box is in place; see page 25.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Fund Commissioners of the **Camden County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund** does hereby resolve and agree to renew membership in the **MEL** for a period of three (3) years, the commencement of which shall be July 1, 2016, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the application for membership is for the purpose of obtaining the following types of coverages:

- 1) Excess Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance and,
- 2) Excess Liability Insurance excess of the Primary Liability provided by the above mentioned Joint Insurance Fund as indicated on the application previously submitted.
- 3) Excess Property including Crime

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the **Camden County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund** hereby adopts the Bylaws of the **MEL** and in accordance therewith, it is understood that coverage is not effective until membership is approved by the **MEL** Commissioners/Executive Committee, State Department of Insurance and State Department of Community Affairs and that coverage is subject to the terms, conditions and limitations as contained in the **MEL's** Coverage Manual and its Commercial Excess Insurance, if any; and, **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Fund Commissioners, or other authorized representative, is authorized and directed to execute any and all written agreements necessary for membership in the **MEL** including, but not limited to, the Indemnity and Trust Agreement in order to implement membership by the **Camden County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund** in the MEL according to its Bylaws, Chapter C.372 Laws of 1983 (NJSA 40A:10-36 et seq.), NJAC 11:15-2 and any other statutes or regulations pertaining thereto.

**Social Engineering:** As previously discussed, a new exposure and potential gap in Cyber Liability insurance coverage is when an employee intentionally transfers assets (such as money or security), but does so as a direct result of a "fraudulent transfer request" committed by a person purporting to be an employee, customer, client, or vendor. This scenario has been dubbed "social engineering". Attached is the endorsement drafted by the MEL's Technical Writer, reviewed and approved by the MEL Coverage Committee, which addresses this exposure via the Crime coverage. The JIF's crime policy limit is \$50,000 and the MEL provides \$950,000 excess of the JIF.

**Failure to Obtain Insurance:** The JIF and MEL Crime Policy excludes coverage for: "Loss that is a direct or indirect result of **your** failure to procure, require, and/or obtain adequate insurance, bond, and/or similar instrument from a third party vendor, whether or not required by law, statute and/or ordinance". The Coverage Committee was asked to consider providing coverage to member towns using vendors to provide online services, most notably collecting recreation registration fees. The Committee worked with the Technical Writer to draft an endorsement that would provide an exception to the exclusion to cover vendors that provide "online" service for member towns at a \$25,000 sub-limit.

#### ENDORSEMENT Cyber Social Engineering Coverages Endorsement for All JIF Coverage Parts and All Forms of Property Loss

This Cyber Social Engineering Coverages ENDORSEMENT modifies such insurance as is afforded by the provisions of the Policy:

FORGERY OR ALTERATION COVERAGE THEFT, DISAPPEARANCE, AND DESTRUCTION COVERAGE ROBBERY AND SAFE BURGLARY COVERAGE COMPUTER FRAUD COVERAGE PUBLIC DISHONESTY COVERAGE

With regard to this ENDORSEMENT, the provisions of the Policy to which this ENDORSEMENT is attached apply, unless modified by ENDORSEMENT.

Coverage is provided for **loss** from the **Member Entity** resulting directly from having transferred, paid or delivered any **Covered Property, Covered Instrument, Property Other Than Money and Securities, and Securities,** as the direct result of a **Fraudulent Transfer Request** committed by a person purporting to be an **Employee**, customer, client, resident, or vendor.

We will only pay for such loss if: (1) with respect to a person purporting to be a customer, client, resident, or vendor, an **Employee**, other than the person who received the transfer request, verified the authenticity of such transfer request using the telephone number than was provided by such customer, client, resident, or vendor, when they opened the account for the **Member Entity**; or (ii) with respect to a person purporting to be an **Employee**, the authenticity of such transfer request is verified in accordance with the **Member Entity**'s internal procedures.

The **Member Entity** must have written internal procedures requiring each and every transfer to be verified.

The **Member Entity** must provide a written warranty or sworn statement verifying the circumstances and/or the **Fraudulent Transfer Request** as well as how the **Member Entity** complied with its internal written procedures for verifying the transfer request and circumstances leading to the **Fraudulent Transfer Request**.

The following is added to **Definitions**.

#### **Additional Definition**

#### CAMDEN COUNTY MUNICIPAL JOINT INSURANCE FUND ADOPTING A PROGRAM TO ASSIST MEMBER MUNICIPALITIES ACHIEVE POLICE ACCREDITATION CERTIFICATION

WHEREAS, the Commission on the Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies ("CALEA") and the State of New Jersey Associations of Chiefs of Police offer programs to certify police department have met the highest standards of police department management; and

**WHEREAS**, the Camden County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund, the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund and its excess liability carriers recognize that accredited police agencies experience significantly fewer liability and workers' compensation claims.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of the Camden County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund seeks to encourage police departments to pursue such excellence by providing a 25% reimbursement of cost upon certification to support efforts to attain accreditation from the Commission on the Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies ("CALEA") or the State of New Jersey Association of Chiefs of Police; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee adopts program requirements, as follows:

- The Mayor and Chief of Police are hereby required to enter into an agreement with the Camden County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund for the receipt of funding of twenty-five percent (25%) of accreditation cost.
- 2. The Municipality agrees to provide funding for the remaining costs associated with becoming accredited. In addition, the Municipality shall attach a certification from their CFO that the balance of the funds are available to complete the police accreditation process and further acknowledge that municipal funds will be spent first, prior to the grant being issued.

- 3. The Member Municipality understands that the JIF shall not be responsible nor will it commit to provide any additional funding to maintain said accreditation, and this is a one time only grant per municipality.
- 4. If the Municipality does not renew its membership in the JIF within three years of receiving the grant, said grant monies would be due to the JIF immediately upon membership expiration.
- The 2016-17 Program will allow for six (6) municipalities to receive the grant monies to become accredited. The Executive Committee will consider the grant applications on a first come, first served basis.

Court decisions made personnel training for managerial and supervisory "mandatory". A signed acknowledgement that the manager or supervisor has completed training within the last 12 months must be placed in the personnel files. Training is also mandatory for the Municipal Judge, the heads of volunteer emergency service organizations such as Volunteer Fire Departments, EMS units, and the heads of organizations such as Library Boards and Planning Boards, etc., that are involved in personnel matters. Police Superior Officers who have taken the training for specifically for them do not need to take this course. Any Superior Officer not taking the police seminar must take this course.

#### Comprehensive Playground Inspection Programs

As spring approaches, it is a great time inspect playgrounds and to review your Playground Maintenance Program. A complete Program consists of visual inspections at three basic frequencies.

#### Annual Audit

A comprehensive playground risk management program starts with an annual audit. An audit consists of inventorying and examining each piece of playground and ancillary equipment, the park grounds and structures, and perimeter streets. We recommend pictures be taken to document the number and condition of each piece of playground equipment and surrounding areas.

#### Periodic (weekly to monthly) Inspections

Spring is the time to ramp-up the inspection program's frequency rate. The frequency of a playground's inspection is determined by several factors; season, how many children use it, harsh environments, neighborhood demographics, age of equipment, history of damage, and more. Owners of playground equipment should have a written policy that defines inspection frequency.

Use a checklist. A sample checklist is on the MEL website (<u>www.njmel.org</u>). A checklist offers the advantage of documenting what was inspected and found to be in satisfactory condition. Only reporting deficiencies leaves the worker who completed the report open to questions of what things were or were not inspected (months or years later). Remember the rule of documentation, "If it is not written down, it did not happen".

#### Daily Inspections

Workers are in the parks almost every day; cutting grass, picking up trash, or even just driving by on way to other assignments. Workers must be trained to visually check the playground equipment and grounds for obvious problems such as broken equipment, graffiti, etc. This quick check does not require paperwork, unless a deficiency is found. Workers should also be instructed to immediately correct conditions that can be fixed, or report conditions as soon as possible. Playground owners should also have a written policy on how workers are to document their corrective actions or reports.

Playgrounds will of course require maintenance and repairs from time to time. Even routine maintenance activities such as replenishing mulch or closing the gaps on S-hooks should be documented. Playground owners should have a 'paper trail' of work performed by employees. Repairs to playground equipment will also need to be documented. Repairs should be with manufacturer's parts. Hardware should be tamper-resistant.

Spring is also a good time to review your policies with employees who will be in and around playgrounds. Hold a Toolbox Talk to remind them how to record actions they took to immediately correct a deficient condition and how to report conditions that will need to be repaired by others. A Toolbox Talk is included to assist with educating employees.

We also want to remind our members of three other resources;

- 1. The MSI has a Playground Safety Inspector class. Check the website for a class near you.
- The MSI has a new online Playground Inspection class. We have included a Discussion Guide so that it can be presented to a group of Recreation or Public Works employees.

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#### Recording / Reporting Playground Deficiencies Toolbox Talk Lesson Plan

The conditions of our playgrounds and parks are important to the residents of our community. Let's take a moment to discuss the policies and procedures we have in place.

Our playgrounds are inspected [INSERT FREQUENCY] by [INSERT DEPARTMENT OR NAME OF INDIVIDUAL]. But we are in or driving past playgrounds and parks almost every day. We can have a bigger impact on the appearance of our parks and playgrounds than any one else. I want to review this department's policies if you see problems in our parks. This includes:

- Damaged playground equipment
- Broken glass
- Graffiti
- [ADD ADDITIONAL OR LOCAL CONCERNS]

If you are in a park, cutting grass or collecting trash, etc., and see a condition that you can correct such as:

- · Mulch around playground equipment that has been significantly kicked out such as under swings
- · Objects, such as tables or toys, that have been moved into the fall zones of playground equipment
- Swings over the top of the swing set
- A loose or broken component that can be quickly fixed, tightened, etc.

Our policy is to take care of it right then and record it [HOW - write it down where, call it in to who, etc.]. If you take 5 minutes to rake mulch back under the swings or sweep up broken glass, which is better than leaving it and having a child injured. The department wants you to take that 5 minutes, but we need to document it.

If you see a condition that will require lengthy repairs, or will need to order parts, such as:

- Broken railings
- Damaged tables

A condition that can be expected to cause injury to a child should be called in immediately to *[WHO]*. If the condition is severe enough stay there until we can make it safe. If it is not an imminent hazard, and you have a cone or CAUTION tape, we would expect you to secure the scene as best you can.

If you see conditions such as:

- Arson
- Intentional damage
- Significant graffiti
- Any other criminal activity

Call [WHO - department and / or the police on their non-emergency number].

An Amusement exclusion to update the definition of amusement rides to include "small truck mounted kiddie rides, inflatable bounce houses, slides and other inflatable attractions as excluded amusements was tabled for further clarification.

The MEL Underwriter issued bulletin 16-29 to clarify the issue of members renting, operating and owning such equipment. The Memo & Endorsement appear on Pages 19 & 20, if the Fund Commissioners agree with the endorsement, a motion would be in order to accept.

**CYBER LIABILITY EXCLUSION:** Several meetings ago, concerns were raised regarding the addition of an exclusion approved by the MEL coverage committee, to the JIF's General Liability policy as it relates to inadvertent disclosure of personally identifiable information. (Page 24) The endorsement requires JIF approval as well. The item was tabled to allow for further review. The concern raised has since been discussed with MEL reinsurer, Conner Strong & Buckelew general counsel and the cyber liability underwriter. Confirmation was received from the cyber liability underwriter that the concern raised is covered under the cyber liability policy. The MEL reinsurer rendered the same opinion. Therefore, we are requesting a motion to approve this endorsement that is a mandate of the MEL reinsurer.

Underwriting Manager said this protects the inaccurate release of confidential information and it will protect your liability against that. The reason we added the exclusion is to dovetail the coverage to stop it where it is suppose to stop and it lines up evenly with the privacy program so there is no overlap in coverage. Mr. Cooney said where we really want all the claims to fall is within the privacy program which is properly underwritten for that confidential information exposure. **PROPERTY APPRAISALS UPDATE:** Asset Works has begun to contact members to begin property appraisals in the Camden JIF. Field work should be complete by early June.

**EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES PROGRAM:** As a reminder, changes to the 2017 POL/EPL Program are posted on the MEL's webpage – <u>www.njmel.org</u> – which details changes to the MEL's Model Personnel Manual and information on training program requirements.

Members have until October 1<sup>st</sup> to submit the checklist to qualify and/or maintain deductible and co-pay incentives. Compliance includes updating Personnel Manuals, Training Managers & Supervisors, Police Command Staff and offering training to non-supervisory personnel.

<u>Police Command Training</u> – Three sessions have been scheduled for May 5<sup>th</sup> in Collingswood, May 10<sup>th</sup> in Voorhees and May 19<sup>th</sup> in Winslow. A notice has been sent and a few additional sessions will be announced.

<u>Managers & Supervisors Training</u> - Employment Practices Risk Management Program also includes mandatory training of management. We are working with the Fund Attorney's office to develop a schedule for these classes and will notify member towns once the dates are set. Attorney Nardi said there are two sessions scheduled thus far, one in Collingswood on May 24<sup>th</sup>, Cherry Hill on May 25<sup>th</sup> and there will also be a session in Winslow and Voorhees. Notices will be sent forthcoming. Attorney Nardi said there will be additional training if there is a demand.

<u>Elected Officials Training Seminars</u> – Every year, the MEL holds training seminars for elected officials and reduces a member's assessment by \$250 for each municipal elected officials and Administrator completing the course by June 1st. Please visit the MEL webpage for other scheduled classes – njmel.org

**CONNER, STRONG & BUCKELEW ANNOUNCEMENT:** Perma's parent company has announced an alliance with Century Equity Partners. On pages 26 & 27 is a memorandum from David Grubb and also an opinion from the MEL's attorney that this alliance does not change contractual terms between Conner, Strong & Buckelew and the MEL and MEL JIFs.

**2016 PRIMA CONFERENCE:** The JIF has authorized the attendance of Board Members at the annual risk management conference for the purpose of attending seminars. The next PRIMA convention will take place in Atlanta from June 5-8. Please notify the Fund office if you are interested in attending.

**2016 FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE FORMS:** The Fund office has provided all Fund Commissioners and Professionals with the login information they need to complete their Financial Disclosure filing for the Camden County JIF. The email included links to the instructions and the DLGS webpage to file your disclosure; filing deadline is April 30<sup>th</sup>. Executive Director said the DCA is serious and issued \$100 fines last year for those who did

not file. We have a listing of members who have filed thus far and reminder notices will be issued to those that have not filed yet.

**LEAGUE MAGAZINE:** Enclosed is the next in a series of MEL advertisements to appear in the League magazine. Each advertisement in the "Power of Collaboration" series will be different and will highlight activities of the MEL and JIFs as well as people who have rendered significant service. (Page 28)

**DUE DILIGENCE REPORTS** – Included in the agenda were due diligence reports as follows: the Financial Fast Track, Pure Loss Ratio Report, Claims Analysis by Fund Year, Claims Activity Report, Lost Time Frequency Report, Interest Rate Summary Comparison Report, and Regulatory Compliance Report.

Executive Director reviewed the Financial Fast Track for January, 2016 and the February 2016 report which was distributed at the meeting. As of February 28, 2016 the statutory surplus stands at \$4.8 million. Expected Loss Ratio Analysis and said for March 2016 where the actuary projected us at 5.54% we are currently at 11.61%. Lost Time Accident Frequency as of March 31st we improved to 1.83 down from last month at 2.02.

Executive Director said last month we discussed the DOT revising the drug testing decreasing the percentage of employees that need to be tested from 50% down to 25%. Coverage Committee recommended we should keep the testing at 50% but we will leave it up to the towns to make their own decision since their may be contracts in place that includes language that the testing would be at CDL standards. Betsy Ciano of Interstate Mobile will be sending a memo to all member municipalities to see if they want to keep the standard at 50% or drop it down to 25%.

Executive Director said last month we also agreed on 25% reimbursement for Police Accreditation for those towns with successful completion. We are working on those agreements and will send a draft to the commissioners. The Fund may have a vote on this matter next month.

Attorney Nardi also discussed a court decision that affects all of us as municipalities which involves OPRA. There was a decision with the Appellate Division with regard to John Paff v. Galloway Township. Mr. Paff was requesting information electronically maintained. The Township conceded that it was easy enough to perform a few keystrokes to provide the information but there were other implications to provide that information, which were the need to redact and it was not specifically provided for within the OPRA statute. Mr. Nardi said the information was available but it was not maintained in the specific form requested so the request was denied. Mr. Paff filed suite and the Law Division ordered in favor of Mr. Paff and awarded significant legal fees. The Appellate Division just reversed the decision last week. Attorney Nardi asked members to make sure your Clerks are made aware of this Appellate decision. Attorney Nardi said even though it may have been very easy to create the report under the statute does not require it. Commissioner Maley said if it does not exist as a document you do not have to create it.

Mr. Saville reviewed the monthly reports. Mr. Saville reminded everyone this coming Wednesday is the second regional training for the year it is the DPW Supervisors Roundtable. Attendance is mandatory for at least one representative from your town.
